SAFETY BRIEF: TEN SAFETY TIPS

There are many aspects of safety that need your full attention, but here are ten that should always be on your mind before, during and after your work is done on every job site.

BEFORE

1. Be prepared! Having the appropriate training and talking to your supervisor about the job you are performing are two ways that will help to make you safe.
2. Know the Hygieneering and our clients safety protocol, written plans, and where to find more information if needed. (i.e. MSDSs, Emergency contact numbers, emergency procedures, etc.)
3. Be aware of all hazards that may be posed on the site, both physical and health hazards. As always, ask questions and let your supervisor know immediately if you have any safety concerns!
4. Conduct a walkthrough of your work area and identify any potential safety issues before starting your work.

DURING

5. Wear the appropriate Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) at all times.
6. Have an open line of communication at all times between your co-workers, client and yourself.
7. Be aware of your surroundings! Never position yourself between moving and fixed objects, watch out for moving vehicles and look out for fall hazards.
8. If working with contractors, observe as applicable they have conducted their roles in aspects that involve your safety (i.e.: equipment is de-energized on abatement jobs).

AFTER

9. Be sure to decontaminate and use good personal hygiene everyday that you may have come in contact with a known hazard. Do not endanger your family and friends by tracking a "take home" hazard.

ALWAYS

10. Always keep a clean site. Before, during and after work, make sure yours and those around your site is in good condition. There are enough potential hazards present without tools lying around, equipment not put away properly, or debris in a work area.
